Accessibility Statement

1. Our Commitment to Accessibility

Dublin Alert is committed to making its website and digital content accessible and usable for as many people as possible, regardless of ability or the technology they use to access the site. We aim to provide clear, readable and navigable content across desktop, tablet and mobile devices.

2. Accessibility Standard

We aim to follow recognised accessibility practices and to work towards the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.1 Level AA. Accessibility is an ongoing process, and we continue to review the website as its design, content and features develop.

3. Features We Aim to Provide

Where reasonably possible, Dublin Alert aims to provide keyboard-friendly navigation, clear headings and page structure, readable text and sufficient contrast, descriptive link text, meaningful alternative text for images where appropriate, responsive layouts for different screen sizes, and accessible forms and navigation controls.

4. Images, Photography and News Content

Dublin Alert is a visual news publication and many articles contain photographs, videos or other media. We aim to provide useful alternative text or descriptions where appropriate. Some editorial images may be published primarily for journalistic context, and descriptions may vary depending on the purpose and nature of the content.

5. Videos and Multimedia

Where we publish video or other multimedia content, we aim to improve accessibility through features such as captions, transcripts or descriptive information where reasonably practicable. Accessibility may vary for content supplied by third parties or embedded from external platforms.

6. Third-Party Content

Some parts of the website may rely on third-party services, embedded content, social media platforms, maps, advertising services or other external technologies. Dublin Alert cannot guarantee the accessibility of content or functionality controlled by third parties, but we aim to choose services that provide appropriate accessibility features where reasonably possible.

7. Known Limitations

Despite our efforts, some content or functionality may not yet fully meet every accessibility requirement. Older content, third-party material, user-submitted material and newly introduced website features may contain accessibility limitations. We aim to identify and address significant issues as they are brought to our attention.
